Plant juniper shrubs in a location with full sun or light shade. When they get too much shade, the branches spread apart in an effort to let more sunlight in, and the damage to their shape can't be repaired. Junipers grow in any type of soil as long as it is well-drained. They are often grown on hills, and other where soil erosion is a problem. Dwarf Juniper - Grows up to 4'. These varieties are commonly used as foundation plants, around gardens, ponds, and as bonsai plants. Small Junipers - These grow up to 6 feet. Water young shrubs well and mulch with pine needles or bark mulch to keep the soil evenly moist and weeds at bay. Fertilize in spring with a layer of compost and an organic plant food for evergreens. Prune junipers in spring after a spurt of new growth to shape the plant and remove dead, broken or diseased branches. Some junipers are susceptible to Gymnosporangium rust disease, and can be a serious problem for those people growing Juniperus rigida - Juniperus communis - Juniper berry - Juniperus virginiana.
